### **Reading of the Land Acknowledgement and Invitation to Worship**

We respectfully acknowledge that we worship and live on the traditional ancestral lands of the Osage & Sioux Nations. We also acknowledge that the history of the Episcopal Church is intertwined with the history of colonialism and slavery. The legacy of these injustices persists today, both in Missouri and across the country.

Jesus calls us into the dream of Beloved Community, and so we make these acknowledgments to affirm our commitment to work towards racial justice, equity, and liberation for all of God's children. As we turn our hearts toward worship, may the Holy Spirit move among us with conviction and inspiration, delivering us from the presumption of coming to the Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

Officiant: Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

### **The Nicene Creed**

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right**

**hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

### **Prayers of the People, Form III**

Holy, merciful, life giving-God, we pray for your holy Catholic Church;  
**That we all may be one.**

Touch our hearts and transform our lives. Grant that every member of the Church learns to truly and humbly serve you;  
**That Your Name may be glorified by all people.**

We pray for the Diocese of Missouri, that in the power of the spirit we may work together to know Christ and make Christ known. We pray for all bishops, priests, and deacons. For Sean, our Presiding Bishop, Deon, our Bishop, Ann & Josh our Priests, Beth our Deacon, Darlene, Matt, and Suhsi, our Aspirants. In our Diocese of Missouri, we pray for the people and ministry of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Ironton and Richard, their Vicar. In our companion Diocese of Puerto Rico, we pray for St. Luke's Episcopal Health System (Sistema de Salud Episcopal San Lucas); and for our companion community, the Journey Church in Fulton and Jessica, their Priest in Charge. We pray for this gathering; and for all ministers and people.

**That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.**

We pray for our leaders, that they will model wisdom, prudence, integrity, fidelity, and courage. Break down walls of division, and inspire us all with a vision of the common good. We pray for Donald, our President, Mike, our Governor, Barbara, our Mayor, and all members of our national and state legislatures and judiciaries. We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world.

**That there may be justice and peace on the earth.**

Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;  
**That our works may find favor in your sight.**

Remembering your power to heal and help us, we pray for all those on our parish prayer list and those we now name aloud or remember in the silence of our hearts.

*(Silence. The People may add their own petitions.)*

Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble;  
**That they may be delivered from their distress.**

We remember your servants departed this life, especially those we name aloud or in our hearts:  
*(Silence. The People may add their own petitions.)*

Give to the departed eternal rest;  
**Let light perpetual shine upon them.**

We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;  
**May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.**

We give you thanks for all the blessings of our lives.

Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

*(Silence. The People may add their own petitions.)*

*The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.*

### **The Confession and Absolution** (BCP pg. 360)

Deacon or priest: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

**Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

Priest: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

*Celebrant* God is with you.

*People* **And also with you.**

*Celebrant* Lift up your hearts.

*People* **We lift them to the Lord.**

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*Celebrant*

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. Because in the mystery of the Word made flesh, you have caused a new light to shine in our hearts, to give the knowledge of your glory in the face of your Son Jesus Christ our Savior. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

**Sanctus:** S129

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full, full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

*The Celebrant continues:* Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker of all.

Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

**People: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.**

*Celebrant*

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Almighty God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Savior. By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. AMEN.

**People: AMEN.**

Officiant: As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray, (BCP. pg. 364) **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.**

*The Celebrant breaks the bread and then the people sing: (S154)*

**Alleluia, Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.**

*The bread and wine are served at the communion rail. A blessing is given to anyone who would like to come forward but does not want to receive communion. Gluten free wafers are available upon request.*

**Post-Communion Prayer**

Celebrant: Let us pray,

**All: Eternal God, you have graciously accepted us as living members of our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Savior. Amen.**

May Christ, the Son of God, be manifest in you, that your lives may be a light to the world; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always. **People: Amen.**
